Who should apply?

The programme is suitable for female middle leaders aspiring towards senior leadership at some point in the future. It is designed for colleagues in a range of educational settings including early years, primary, secondary, post 16 and special schools and is open to both teaching and support staff.

Applicants must be able to attend all sessions, complete inter-sessional activities and be fully committed to the collaborative, supportive yet challenging nature of this programme.
